The following important information, which has come out of discussions from our recent meeting, is to help keep you aware of current issues or concerns in Rhode Island athletics.

1. A letter was sent to the RIIL from Fr. Jo Creedon requesting no activities on Sunday mornings and Sunday evenings.
2. April 30th "Victory With Character" Conference at Bryant University.
3. Awards Committee has awarded the scholarships to Tim Bristow of LaSalle Academy and Eliza Foresti from Mount St. Charles Academy.
4. Tom has sent a letter to all Principals regarding a Licensing Agreement with LRG Marketing. It is a voluntary program. There does not seem to be enough information about this program and not enough information has been presented to make a decision about whether this is a worthy initiative.
5. Sports Medicine Committee has recommended the use of mouth guards in all non-contact sports.
6. Awards Banquet – April 8th at Rhodes. Tickets are \$40. No paper tickets, your name will be at the door.
7. Golf tournament will be June 26 at Triggs. We will be looking for Tee Signs.
8. The Executive Board will be looking into a certificate for our members for the number of years of service to the RIIAAA.
9. The RIIAAA By-Laws have been revised and brought up to date with the appropriate changes. A motion was made to accept the changes as is by Todd Grimes and seconded by Al DiGregorio at the Cape general meeting. The motion passed.
