

Sports Committee News

Fall: There has been quite a bit of discussion in the boys' and *girls' soccer* sports committees over new overtime rules for the playoffs. The boys' committee is putting in place a "one 10-minute overtime period" and then a "golden goal, sudden-death format" in the second overtime. The girls' soccer committee is resisting the implementation of this format for their playoffs. The two committees are working together to come up with a solution.

The *football* sports committee held a meeting on April 13 to discuss the current alignment and proposals moving forward.

Winter: Winter sports committees wrapped up the administration of the winter seasons. Other than a few minor issues, the winter season ran relatively smoothly with weather becoming too big of an issue.

The *wrestling* sports committee reported that the States and New England championships, both held at the PCTA were very successful.

Spring: Spring sports committees are currently in the process administering the spring seasons.

Baseball has instituted a new "pitch-count" system this year. There have been a few, minor technological glitches on the RIIL website with the pitch count, but those have been rectified in a timely fashion.

The *softball* sports committee is currently meeting with officials over contract negotiations.


The *RIIL offices* will be relocating to a new building located at *875 Centerville Road in Warwick*. The office will be closed for two days in May when the move takes place.


