

Greetings from the RIIAAA Executive Board

The following important information, which has come out of discussions from our recent meetings, is to help keep you aware of current issues or concerns in Rhode Island athletics

Sports Committee News

Fall: The fall sports committees completed the realignment process. Realignment proposals are going to be reviewed by the RIIAAA Executive Board at the March meeting before heading to the Principals' Committee on Athletics for approval.

Winter: There has been a great deal of discussion on gymnastics. The concern that has been brought forward is that only 10 schools were able to field gymnastics teams this year. A number of talented gymnasts are not competing at the high school level because the schedule conflicts with their club gymnastics seasons.

Concerns have also been discussed regarding boys' and girls' swimming and the sports committee's decision to have a school's boys and girls teams split for divisional championships. The swimming sports committee is continuing to look at these issues.

Spring: The outdoor track sports committee is evaluating the divisional alignment in outdoor track. The lack of tracks makes keeping 4 divisions difficult with new schools participating in the sport and the lack of schools that have tracks. The committee is working on trying to even out the divisions based upon geography and other logistical considerations.

Several changes were made in softball alignment for the 2018 season. New schools participating in softball for the first time in the RIIL made the new alignments necessary.

RIIL News

The RIIL has had several discussions regarding eligibility of student-athletes being home schooled or alternative schools.


The importance of communication among athletic directors when rescheduling games on *rSchool Today* was again discussed. Athletic directors should not be making changes without communicating with the opposing school's athletic director and the assignors/officials for that contest.

A committee of principals, superintendents, athletic directors, and RIIL officials is being created to examine a
