George Finn earned a bachelor's degree from Northeastern University, Boston, Massachusetts in Athletic Training and Physical Education. While attending Northeastern he interned with Bowdoin College, Massachusetts Institute of Technology, and the New York Jets. He continued his graduate studies at Northeastern University, and then Husson College in Maine. Mr. Finn

began his career in Wellesley, Massachusetts working at Charles River Sports Therapy, and as the Head Athletic Trainer for the Boston Bolts Professional Soccer team. In 1989, he accepted a position at Bates College in Lewiston, Maine as Director of Sports Medicine. In 1995, he was also appointed Assistant Director of Athletics at Bates. In the summer of 1999, Mr. Finn became the Director of Athletics and Student Activities for Barrington Public Schools, in Barrington, Rhode Island.

Currently, he is the Sport Director for both Boys and Girls Lacrosse in the Rhode Island Interscholastic League. He serves as the Chair of the Rhode Island Interscholastic League Sports Medicine Committee, and is member of the Rhode Island Interscholastic Athletic Administrators Association Executive Board. He served two terms as a Boys Lacrosse Rules Committee Member for the National Federation of State High School Associations (2003 to 2006, 2012 to 2014). In 2005, he was appointed by the Governor of Rhode Island and continues to serve as a committee member on the Department of Health Board of Athletic Trainers. He is a certified member of the National Athletic Trainer's Association, and is a Licensed Athletic Trainer in Rhode Island and Massachusetts.

George was the go to person while Barrington MS fields were under construction, building a state of the art athletic facility. As a RIIAAA Executive Board member, he is the liaison to the RI DOH facilitating good decision making for the membership of the RIIAAA. He is a 2004 RIIAAA Athletic Director of the Year, 2015 NIAAA State Award of Merit Recipient, 2016 RIIL Athletic Director of the Year and 2017 NHFS Citation Finalist.
