Sister Charlene Tedeschi Distinguished Service Award

Candidate should be someone other than a RIAAA member who has contributed to Rhode Island athletics in their local community or on a statewide level. Candidate should be nominated for his/her promotion and assistance with the improvement of high school athletics through his/her involvement in youth and/or recreational programs. Candidate should display dedication, compassion and care towards youth, characteristics that Sister Charlene Tedeschi exhibited during her tenure as Director of Athletics at Bay View Academy.
