- 5. Sport Committee Reports:
  - a. **Outdoor Track:** Facilities are the major concern in outdoor track. Division/Class meets will have a minimum standard per event that must be met to qualify for these events. There is still a four (4) athlete per event maximum participation.
  - **b. Swim:** Based on the current placement of dual performance meets, a concern was brought forth that boys and girls should be placed in appropriate divisions based on the realignment process. Some teams are penalized participating in divisions higher than they belong because of the dual event schedule.
  - c. **Girls' Lacrosse:** An allowance of just six (6) games a day by the girls' lacrosse officials has placed a hurdle on sports scheduling. This issue has been brought to the attention of the RIIL.
  - d. **Softball:** South Kingstown will be running an Injury Fund Softball Tournament, Saturday March 29, 2014 starting at 8:00 am at the Mt. Pleasant Fields. There will be a 3 game minimum for all teams that participate, cost will \$50.00, checks made out to SKHS. Contact Terry Lynch at <u>tlynch@skschools.net</u> asap.

- 6. Congratulations to Terry Lynch, South Kingstown for being selected as the RIIAAA Athletic Director of the Year and to Greg Kortick, West Warwick for West Warwick High School being selected the first George Nasuti School of the Year.
