- 3. Kudos to Christopher Hughes, Performance Physical Therapy, for his introduction to his Physical Therapy Group with nine locations throughout RI.
- 4. Congratulations to Bob Palazzo, Classical, for his induction into the Rhode Island Track Coaches Hall of Fame.
- 5. Congratulations to Frank Geiselman, Cumberland, for his induction to the RI Interscholastic League Hall of Fame.
- 6. Committee Reports:
  - a) Boys' Basketball met to realign, Consideration to the higher seed hosting thru the semi-finals is a tabled topic. Concern for the lack of Medical coverage at neutral site games was discussed.
  - b) **Baseball**: Dr. Michael Whaley, Burrillville Principal will serve as the Baseball Sports Director.
  - c) **Competition Cheer**: Issues with social media will be part of the agenda for the April 2, 2014 post season meeting.

- d) **Football**: Start dates are published for the fall 2014 season.
- e) **Golf:** Bob Duarte, East Providence, will serve on the sport committee as the Director.
- f) Indoor Track: A meeting was held to review the State Championship format.
- g) **Middle School Softball:** The mound is now at 43' to match the High School pitching distance.
- h) **Volleyball:** At least one Athletic Director and two coaches ask the sport committee to consider moving Boys' Volleyball to the fall and Girls' Volleyball to the spring.
- i) **Wrestling:** With 16 teams in Division I and 18 teams Division II, the committee will evaluated who really belongs in Division I. PCOA is looking to drop the Division II State tournament. They are also looking to move the State Championships to URI in the future. The Committee will be meeting after the Wrestling banquet which is on April 8, 2014.
- j) **Hockey** will be meeting soon to realign for 2014-2016.
- k) **Realignment Committee:** 2014 date for fall and winter are available at the RIIL Office.
- I) **Awards Banquet:** At the time of the meeting 274 responses to attend were placed.

  - c. Kudos to North Kingstown HS for hosting the most recent RIIL Student Sport Leaders Workshop. Continued success to the RIIL Student Advisory Board and its pursuit of Excellence in Sports.
